INTERACT CLUBS

FOR 12 -18 YEAR OLDS

School Interact Clubs are like a junior Rotary Club at your School.

They offer young people aged 12 to 18 the opportunity to develop leadership and teamwork skills.

Each Interact Club is sponsored by a local Rotary Club and just like an adult Club is able to elect its own officers and keep its own 'books'. Sponsoring Rotary Club will give guidance in developing local and international service projects. Members can organise and take part in fun activities, raise money for local charities, perhaps to travel and experience different cultures and to make new friends.

Why not ask your teacher if your school could find out having your own Interact Club?



A team competition for 11 to 13 yr olds & 14 to 17 year olds.

Speaking in public is an important life skill and the Rotary Youth Speaks competition helps to build the self-confidence and self esteem of those taking part.

This competition offers you:

- Experience of speaking on a public platform as members of a team.
- Chance to get your ideas on topical subjects over to an audience within a limited set time.
- Opportunity to practise the way you speak, how to present your ideas and look after your appearance.
- Impartial assessment of your performance by experienced judges.

Each team is made up of 3 pupils, a Chairperson, a Speaker and a Proposer of the Vote of Thanks. There are four stages in the competition - Local and District, Region and the National Final.

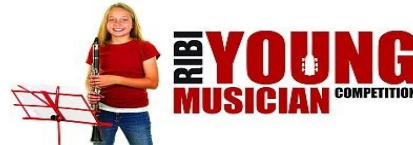
If you think that your School would like to enter a team, ask your teacher to contact your local Rotary Club to see if they will organise a competition.



There are three categories in this competition:

Primary School, High School and College

Each category may enter: up to, 7 colour prints, 7 black and white prints or up to 2 portfolio sets - (each portfolio must contain 10 photographs by at least 5 pupils.



An Instrumental and Vocal competition for young people under 18 year olds.

Are you learning to play a musical instrument or enjoy singing and can learn and perform a solo piece?

This competition could offer you:

- the experience of performing on a public stage,
- the chance to showcase your musical talent & receive the impartial criticism and assessment by experienced judges.

There are four stages through to the National Finals.

Details of local competitions are sent to schools.



For secondary age students in High Schools and Colleges, Technology Tournaments require teams of four Design and Technology students to devise and build a solution to an unseen technical task.

Working against the clock, teams will need good communication skills, be well organised and will produce a design portfolio to show how they have arrived at the solution to their task.

At the end of the day the solution in the form of a working model will be tested and judged against competing teams from your school and neighbouring schools & colleges



A competition for 11yr old to 17yr old

Celebrating the amazing achievements of young people across UK, the Rotary Young Citizen Awards showcase the leadership, citizenship and important responsibilities assumed by many young people under the age of 25 in the UK.

Winners receive trophies and a cash prize of £500 at the National Rotary Conference where the awards are presented live each year on the *BBC News Channel*.

Winners get a special invitation to visit the BBC News TV studios and will also receive a tour of the Houses of Parliament.
